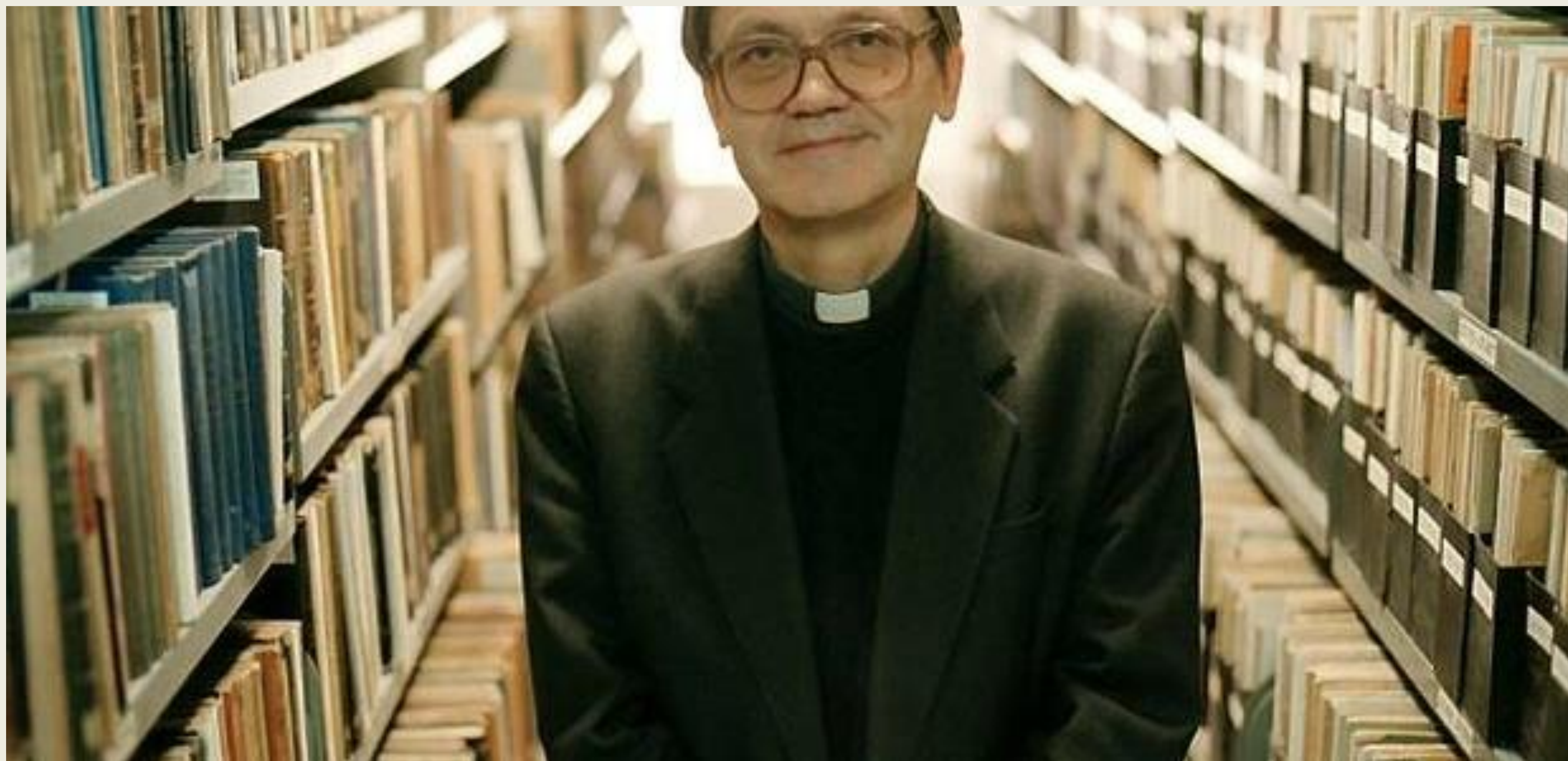








# **„Jews of Sandomierz accused of a ritual murder, 1698 & 1710”**











**This painting illustrates a ritual murder, allegedly made by the Jews of Sandomierz to add the blood of a Christian child for Passover matzot. This event is not consistent with the historical truth, and could have never taken place. The laws of Judaism forbid the consumption of blood.**

**The Jews couldn't do ritual murders and they never did. Because of another accusations of a similar nature they were often persecuted and murdered – that happened also in Sandomierz.**

**Since the thirteenth century the popes forbade dissemination of such false allegations and they defended the Jews from this accusations.**
